The congregation stands as is comfortable and faces the baptismal font at the invitation of the presiding minister.

P: Alleluia! Christ is risen.

# C: Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

P: Brothers and sisters, on this day when we celebrate the rising of Christ from death, let us gather at the water to celebrate our baptism, which is the sign and seal of our new life in Christ. Holy God, holy and merciful, holy and mighty,

# C: you are the river of life, you are the everlasting wellspring.

P: In mercy and might you have freed us from death and raised us with Jesus, the firstborn of the dead.

C: In the waters of baptism our old life is washed away, and in them we are born anew.

P: Glory to you, O God, for oceans and lakes, for rivers and streams.

C: Honor to you for waters that wash us clean, quench our thirst, and nurture both crops and creatures.

P: Praise to you for the life-giving water of baptism, the outpouring of the Spirit of the new creation.

C: Through these waters, wash away our sin and all that separates us from you. Cleanse us from our fears and drown our divisions. Empower our witness to your resurrection. Strengthen our resolve in seeking justice for all.



# FIRST READING: Acts 4:5-12

<sup>5</sup>The next day [the] rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, <sup>6</sup>with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and

Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. <sup>7</sup>When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" <sup>8</sup>Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, <sup>9</sup>if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, <sup>10</sup>let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. <sup>11</sup>This Jesus is 'the stone that was rejected by you, the builders;

it has become the cornerstone.'

<sup>12</sup>There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved."

# SECOND READING: 1 John 3:16-24

<sup>16</sup>We know love by this, that [Jesus Christ] laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. <sup>17</sup>How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?

<sup>18</sup>Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. <sup>19</sup>And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him <sup>20</sup>whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. <sup>21</sup>Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; <sup>22</sup>and we receive from him whatever we ask,

because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

<sup>23</sup>And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. <sup>24</sup>All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

# GOSPEL READING: John 10:11-18

P: The Holy Gospel according to John.

# C: Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said:] <sup>11</sup> I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. <sup>12</sup>The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. <sup>13</sup>The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. <sup>14</sup>I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, <sup>15</sup>just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup>I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. <sup>17</sup>For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. <sup>18</sup>No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

#### **NICENE CREED**

A: Together let us profess the faith of the Church.

C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

A: Almighty God, we give thanks for native peoples who first inhabited and protected the lands of their ancestors. Lead nations and communities to share resources, cooperate in solving conflicts, and bring an end to war and insurrection. Guide us as citizens to make good choices in elections, and help all those with power to share it and to use such power for good. God of mercy,

# C: hear our prayer.

A: Loving God, protect the very young and the very old, those living without permanent housing, victims of domestic abuse, the unemployed and the under-employed, those imprisoned physically and those imprisoned by addiction, and all who live with chronic illness or compromised immune systems. We pray especially for Cindy, Kody, Jay, Bill, Elizabeth, Dottie, Jerry, Doug, Jordan, Christian, Arla, Marge, Jerry, Terrie, Naoma, Boden, Andy D., and those we name before you now, aloud or in the silence of our hearts. (pause) Guide communities to actively care for people who are vulnerable. God of mercy,

A: Gracious God, help this and all communities of faith to listen for your voice. Call us away from things of this world that distract us from following you. As we give thanks for our ancestors in faith, including Anselm of Canterbury and all who labored to help generations understand the good news of the gospel, strengthen us to share the good news to those who have yet to hear it. God of mercy,

A: Merciful God, we commend to you all for whom we pray, for the sake of your crucified and risen Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen.


# THE SHARING OF PEACE

C: And also with you.


P: Lift up your hearts.

C: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

P: It is indeed right that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to you, O God, holy Father, through Christ our Savior. For our sins he was lifted high upon the cross, that he might draw the whole world to himself; and, by his suffering and death, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who put their trust in him. And so, with the Church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:



P: Blessed are you, God of heaven and earth, for you have had mercy on us and given your only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

We give you thanks for the priceless grace you have bestowed upon us through Jesus Christ, who died upon the tree of Calvary and rose again to make us living branches, drawing our life from him and bearing fruit in all the world.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for

you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Send, now your Holy Spirit, the Spirit of truth and power, to renew our faith as we receive our crucified and risen Lord who comes to us in his body and blood. Draw us together as the Body of Christ, and in the fullness of time gather us with all your saints into the joy of our true eternal home.

Through Jesus Christ, all glory and honor are yours, Almighty God, with the Holy Spirit, in your holy church, both now and forever.
